

**MINUTES
LOUISVILLE CITY COUNCIL
APRIL 15, 2013

Louisville City Council met in regular session with Mayor-Council Member Fallot presiding.

7:00 P.M. – PUBLIC HEARINGS:

ORDINANCE NO. 13-09 – BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE ZONING DISTRICTS AS PROVIDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 79-33 WHEREBY CHANGING THE LANDS DESCRIBED HEREIN FROM R-1 SINGLE-FAMILY LOW DENSITY SUBURBAN RESIDENTIAL TO PGM1 PARK, GOVERNMENTAL AND MAJOR INSTITUTIONAL DISTRICT

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Tom Ault reported on the following items:

- Met with a potential new business regarding incentive programs
- Upcoming changes in healthcare – the City Clerk and Finance Director participated in a webinar. New regulations for full-time will be anyone working 30 hours

PERSONS APPEARING BEFORE COUNCIL

Ryan Landi of Testa addressed the Council regarding the proposed Stone Ridge Village. He apologized for a recent miscommunication regarding the state's approval of their loan application. The letter was a requirement for the grant application process. The actual approval date is June 12th.

Bill Ecrement, President of the Louisville Eagles presented a \$1,000 check to Police Chief Andy Turowski. Mr. Ecrement encouraged City officials to contact the Eagles when a department may need a donation for specific items.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried for the second reading of Ordinance No. 13-09. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member Fallot declared Ordinance No. 13-09 duly passed and enacted.

AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 13-17 – BEING AN ORDINANCE MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE, STARK COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO, FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2013, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the second reading of Amended Ordinance No. 13-17. The vote: All yea.

MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER FALLOT MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried to suspend the rules to allow for the emergency adoption of Amended Ordinance No. 13-17. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member Fallot declared Amended Ordinance No. 13-17 duly passed and enacted.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor-Council Member Fallot informed the Council that she received a letter from Girl Scout troop 736 requesting space for a community project. They would like to start a community garden for residents. They mentioned the old middle school property. City Manager Tom Ault commented on the possibility of North Street.

Mayor-Council Member Fallot informed the Council that she received a letter from the Louisville Public Library requesting a joint meeting to review their preliminary construction “concept” and project plan of the new Louisville-Nimishillen Public Library & Community Center. They would also like to discuss the current City-Library Land agreement and explore the possible acquisition by the Board of the property at the corner of Mill and Gorgas Streets, that was conveyed to the City by the Library in the land swap agreement in November of 2010. They would like to meet some time in May or June.

Mayor-Council Member Fallot informed the Council of a letter she received from the Louisville Constitution Committee requesting a donation for the upcoming Constitution Festival events.

Mayor-Council Member Fallot commented that people are parking in the grass at Metzger Park and causing ruts. There are no parking on the grass signs at the park entrance. The Police Department will be conducting increased patrol in the park.

Council Member Guiley would like to see park cleanup incorporated into the sentencing process of Teen Court. The issue of adult supervision and training was discussed.

RESOLUTION NO. 13-18 – BEING A RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING LOUISVILLE TEEN COURT AND CITY STAFF TO INCORPORATE INTO THE SENTENCING PROCESS, CITY PARK CLEANUP

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER FALLOT, and the motion carried for the adoption of Resolution No. 13-18. The vote: All yea.
