Louisville City Council met in regular session with Mayor-Council Member Fallot presiding.

7:00 P.M. – CALL TO ORDER

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried to approve the May 20, 2013 Council agenda. The vote: All yea.

Council was presented with a financial statement prepared by the Department of Finance indicating the City's financial status for the month ending April 30, 2013.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Tom Ault reported on the following items:

- Mary Beth Shea has moved out of town and is no longer able to serve on the Design Review Board. The City Clerk will advertise the two vacant positions.
- Appointment of a Property Maintenance Board. Will check to see if the Design Review Board could serve.
- 20 high grass/weeds letters have been sent out.
- The City auction raised approximately \$55,000.

PERSONS APPEARING BEFORE COUNCIL

Peggie Conner addressed the Council on behalf of her son Tom Mickley regarding no parking signs that were erected on Michigan Boulevard. City Manager Tom Ault commented that there is no curb or gutter and when people park on the street they are parking on property owners grass. Area residents complained and requested no parking signs. The City Manager met with the Police Chief and the Director of Service Operations and it was determined that no parking signs would be installed.

Ms. Conner informed the Council that the people in her son's apartment building have nowhere to park.

City Manager Tom Ault commented there is a neighborhood dispute going on. He offered to host a meeting with all of the neighbors to resolve their issues.

Ms. Conner requested that the City remove some of the signs. She indicated that one of the neighbors agreed to this with her son.

Police Chief Andy Turowski will send an officer to meet with each resident regarding the parking issue.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried for the adoption of Resolution No. 13-22. The vote: All yea.

ORDINANCE NO. 13-23 – BEING AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE, STARK COUNTY, OHIO; AMENDING SECTION 157.01(F) OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE RELATIVE TO THE EMPLOYMENT PROVISIONS OF THE EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 13-23. The vote: All yea.

ORDINANCE NO. 13-24 – BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE ZONING DISTRICTS AS PROVIDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 79-33 WHEREBY CHANGING THE LANDS DESCRIBED HEREIN FROM B-5 GENERAL RETAIL, OFFICE AND MOTORIST SERVICES BUSINESS DISTRICT TO I-1 RESTRICTED INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 13-24. The vote: All yea.

NEW BUSINESS

Council Member Guiley informed the Council that he is not happy with the way the no parking issue on Michigan Boulevard was handled. People have been parking there for 40 to 50 years.

Mayor-Council Member Falot informed the Council that she and Council Member Guidone will be out of town for the June 3rd Council meeting. She asked that the meeting be canceled. The City Clerk will inform Council next week if there are any items for the June 3rd agenda.

There will be a Special Meeting on May 28th at 5:30 to discuss issues at Wilson Park.

Mayor-Council Member Falot informed the Council that she presented a proclamation to Eagle Scout Ben McCauley tonight at the Christ United Methodist Church.
