**FINANCIAL REPORT OF RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS FOR THE MONTH ENDING MAY 31, 2014**

Council was presented with a financial statement prepared by the Department of Finance indicating the City's financial status for the month ending May 31, 2014.

**CITY MANAGER'S REPORT**

City Manager Tom Ault reported on the following items:

- Legislation will be presented at the July 7<sup>th</sup> Council meeting requesting approval of an amendment to the Stark-Tuscarawas-Wayne Solid Waste Management Plan. There are no changes affecting Louisville. Louisville is the largest municipality in Stark County that does not require curb side recycling. The City Manager will acquire a copy of Canal Fulton's program. This could tie in to a contract with a single hauler.
- Director of Service Operations Jim McBeath reported that the City worked jointly with Nimishillen Township to patch and pave a portion of Beck Road. Jim also reported with today's flooding issues the Wastewater Treatment Plant is pumping 5,000 gallons of water per minute and losing ground. A lot is due to inflow of rainwater entering the sanitary sewer lines causing an overload on the equipment. A lot of the inflow is coming from illegal hookups of downspouts and sump pumps tying in to the sanitary sewer lines when they should be connected to the storm sewers. This problem needs to be addressed. City Manager Tom Ault commented a starting point could be a point of sale inspection requirement. When a house is sold there would be an inspection of the downspouts, floor drains and sump pump connections.

**PERSONS APPEARING BEFORE COUNCIL**

Mike Snyder representing AEP Energy Savers Program addressed the Council informing them they have reached 82% of their goal. He urged residents to go on line and complete a survey for one point. They will then receive a box with light bulbs, a night light, and receptacle plate covers. If they reach their goal, AEP will give financial incentives to the YMCA and the Historical Society. Deadline is June 30<sup>th</sup>.

City Council discussed placing a 2.7 mill road levy on the November ballot. Council Members McAlister and Casar directed staff to prepare legislation for the July 7<sup>th</sup> Council meeting.

Council Member McAlister thanked the Kiwanis Club for planting the entrances at Metzger Park and Constitution Park.
