Louisville City Council met in regular session with Mayor-Council Member Fallot presiding.

7:00 – PUBLIC HEARING:

AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 14-20 – BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS 1157 AND 1153 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE

CALL TO ORDER

COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried to amend the July 7, 2014 Council agenda adding Ordinance No. 14-35. The vote: All yea.

Council Members bowed their heads for a moment of silent prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF THE JUNE 16, 2014 COUNCIL MEETING

Mayor-Council Member Fallot declared the minutes of the June 16, 2014 Council meeting approved as presented.

FINANCIAL REPORT OF RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS FOR THE MONTH ENDING JUNE 30, 2014

Council was presented with a financial statement prepared by the Department of Finance indicating the City's financial status for the month ending June 30, 2014.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Tom Ault reported on the following items:

- The Fire Chief will be tracking his hours to make sure that the 50/50 split in Fire and EMS funds is accurate.
- Ohio Valley Energy is requesting the purchase of potable water for one to two oil wells. The proposed contract has a rate of \$10 per 1,000 gallons of water.

Fire Chief Rod Bordner informed the Council of a propane leak for a cooling unit in a box truck on West Main Street on July 4th. West Main Street at California and neighboring streets were closed. Hazmat was called for assistance. Eventually the propane was burned off safely which took nine hours.

AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 14-20 – BEING AN AMENDED ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS 1157 AND 1153 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the second reading of Amended Ordinance No. 14-20. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member Falot declared Amended Ordinance No. 14-20 duly passed and enacted.

ORDINANCE NO. 14-31 – BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1134 – ARCHITECTURAL DESIGN REVIEW OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE

COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried to have Ordinance No. 14-31 returned to the Design Review Board asking them to consider different standards for the old downtown and to review the signage rules and procedures. The vote: All yea.

ORDINANCE NO. 14-32 – BEING AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR THE STARK-TUSCARAWAS-WAYNE JOINT SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER MCALISTER, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 14-32. The vote: All yea.

ORDINANCE NO. 14-33 – BEING AN ORDINANCE TO REQUEST THE STARK COUNTY AUDITOR, PURSUANT TO SECTION 5705.03(B)(1) AND 5705.191 OF THE REVISED CODE TO CERTIFY TO THE CITY COUNCIL OF LOUISVILLE, STARK COUNTY, OHIO, AS TAXING AUTHORITY FOR THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE, THE TOTAL CURRENT TAX VALUATION OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE, AS A SUBDIVISION, AND THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF REVENUE THAT WILL BE GENERATED BY A PROPOSED ADDITIONAL TAX LEVY OF TWO AND SEVEN TENTHS (2.7) MILLS FOR FIVE (5) YEARS FOR THE GENERAL CONSTRUCTION, RECONSTRUCTION, RESURFACING, AND REPAIR OF STREETS, ROADS AND BRIDGES IN THE CITY AS PROVIDED FOR IN REVISED CODE SECTION 5705.19(G), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER MCALISTER, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 14-33. The vote: All yea.

MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER FALLOT MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER MCALISTER, and the motion carried to suspend the rules to allow for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 14-33. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 14-33. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member FalLOT declared Ordinance No. 14-33 duly passed and enacted.

City Council had a lengthy discussion on the proposed road levy. Council Member Guiley requested staff for additional information on the need for a road levy. He requested Fire Chief Bordner, Police Chief Turowski and Director of Service Operations McBeath to prepare presentations regarding cuts that could be made in their departments in order to have funds available for street repairs.

Council Member Guiley commented that the Council needs to be able to show residents that we have no choice but to place a road levy on the ballot. He wants other options explored first.

Council Member Guidone was very surprised that no residents were in attendance.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 14-34. The vote: All yea.

MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER FALLOT MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried to suspend the rules to allow for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 14-34. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 14-34. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member FalLOT declared Ordinance No. 14-34 duly passed and enacted.

ORDINANCE NO. 14-35 – BEING AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH OHIO VALLEY ENERGY FOR THE SALE OF POTABLE WATER, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 14-35. The vote: All yea.

MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER FALLOT MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried to suspend the rules to allow for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 14-35. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 14-35. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member FalLOT declared Ordinance No. 14-35 duly passed and enacted.

NEW BUSINESS
