Council was presented with a financial statement prepared by the Department of Finance indicating the City's financial status for the month ending November 30, 2015.

## **CITY MANAGER'S REPORT**

City Manager Tom Ault reported on the following items:

- The new Council Member orientation has been canceled due to Rick Flory being ill.
- Kudos to AEP customer service last week for their assistance with two customer based requests. Nearly a dozen residents on Glenbar and Glenbrook signed a request for the street light at 523 Glenbar to be turned off in order for people to better view the Christmas light displays in their neighborhood. One phone call to our local representative, Damien McGee, got this request handled. In another part of town, a resident and whoever she contacted at AEP apparently misunderstood one another as the resident attempted to report a burned out street light. She then called City Hall. Again, a phone call to Damien was returned promptly and the misunderstanding was corrected, resulting in a work order being issued within thirty minutes of the call.

MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER FALLOT MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried to suspend the rules to allow for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 15-45. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member Fallot declared Ordinance No. 15-45 duly passed and enacted.

**ORDINANCE NO. 15-47** – BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 28 – WAGES, OF THE CONTRACT WITH THE OHIO PATROLMEN'S BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION ON BEHALF OF THE POLICE PATROL OFFICERS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 15-47. The vote: All yea.

MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER FALLOT MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried to suspend the rules to allow for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 15-47. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 15-47. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member Fallot declared Ordinance No. 15-47 duly passed and enacted.

**ORDINANCE NO. 15-48** – BEING AN ORDINANCE REPEALING AND REPLACING CHAPTER 701 GENERAL LICENSING PROVISIONS OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 15-48. The vote: All yea.

**ORDINANCE NO. 15-49** – BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SCHEDULE OF FEES TO BE EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2015 FOR THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 15-49. The vote: All yea.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried authorizing the City Manager to issue a tapping license to Durley Excavating. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried appointing City Manager Tom Ault as the City's representative to SCOG. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried appointing Planning Director Vince Marion as the City's alternate representative to SCOG. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried appointing Council Member elect Joanie Aljancic to the Volunteer Fire Fighter's Dependents Fund Board. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried appointing Mayor-Council Member Fallot to the Volunteer Fire Fighter's Dependents Fund Board. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER MCALISTER, and the motion carried to reappoint Joyce Hudnell to a three year term on the Civil Service Commission. The vote: Guiley yea, McAlister yea, Casar yea, Fallot abstained, Guidone yea.

Mike Thomas of 2001 South Nickelplate addressed the Council with his desire to serve on the Tree Board. He was asked if he would be able to attend the meetings. He commented that he would and would like to contribute to the Board.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER MCALISTER, and the motion carried to reappoint Pat Smith to a three year term on the Tree Board. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER MCALISTER MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried to appoint Michael Thomas to a three year term on the Tree Board. The vote: All yea.

Bill Croxton of 715 East Reno Drive addressed the Council with his desire to serve on the Design Review Board. If City Council reappoints Gary Carper then there will be no opening on this Board. Mr. Croxton was asked if he would be interested in serving on the Planning Commission. Mr. Croxton wasn't sure if he could make a five year commitment. He will consider.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried to reappoint Gary Carper to a three year term on the Design Review Board. The vote: All yea.

Bill Ramage informed the Council that due to circumstances that Council is unable to appoint him the Board of Zoning Appeals, he would like to continue serving on the Design Review Board.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY, and the motion carried to reappoint Dan Casar to a three year term on the Board of Zoning Appeals. The vote: Guiley yea, McAlister yea, Casar abstained, Fallot yea, Guidone yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried to reappoint Bruce Barth to a three year term on the Board of Zoning Appeals. The vote: All yea.

Police Chief Andy Turowski reported the department is in the process of gathering end of the year statistics.

Service Director Bill Glick reported the department repaired a storm sewer that collapsed last week near the walking trail and the old K of C.

Fire Chief Rod Bordner reported the Fire Department is 8 runs shy of last year. The department received \$1,000 donation from the American Legion.

Council Member Guiley praised the Fire Department for their promptness and professionalism in putting out a chimney fire at his residence.

Planning Director Vince Marion reported the Design Review Board will be reviewing 2 signs tomorrow evening. One for Kate's Place and one for T-Mobile. Redwood project is moving along. They pulled 8 more permits and will be submitting plans for Phases II and III.

The meeting was adjourned.
