7:00 – PUBLIC HEARINGS:

ORDINANCE NO. 15-17 – BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE ZONING DISTRICTS AS PROVIDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 79-33 WHEREBY ADDING THE LANDS DESCRIBED HEREIN TO R-1, B-4 AND B-5

CITY MANAGER’S REPORT

City Manager Tom Ault reported on the following items:

- Reminder the next cruise in will be held on June 10th. It will be moved from Gorgas Street to East Main Street on a trial basis.

ORDINANCE NO. 15-25 – BEING AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE STARK COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT FOR MOSQUITO SPRAYING SERVICES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

NEW BUSINESS

MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER FALLOT MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER MCALISTER, and the motion carried to appoint Polly Stieber to an unexpired term on the Tree Board (term expires on 12/31/16). The vote: All yea.

Water/Wastewater Superintendent Bill Glick informed the Council that planters will start restoration of the State Route 44 project this week.

Council Member Guidone asked about the sink hole on Nickelplate. Bill informed him that he is aware of it and it involves working around gas lines.

Council Member McAlister thanked the Kiwanis Club for planting flowers at the entrances of Metzger Park and Wildwood Park and their work on the Rainbow playground restorations.

Bill Glick also reported on a major water line break over the holiday weekend. Water at one hundred homes had to be shut off for a short time.

Fire Chief Rod Bordner informed Council the department has had 646 runs this year, an increase of 22 over 2014.

Director of Planning and Development Vince Marion reported Father and Son expansion is on the upcoming Board of Zoning Appeals agenda. There is a community survey on the City's website. Paper copies are available at City Hall and the library. The first public forum will be held on June 30th at 6:00. The educational session on the Historic District is scheduled for June 30th at 2:00.

City Manager Tom Ault thanked the cub scouts for cleaning up Wildwood Park. He will be attending the Constitution Committee meeting on Wednesday and meeting with Arts in Stark on Thursday with the Chamber of Commerce.
