7:00 – CALL TO ORDER

Louisville City Council met in regular session with Mayor-Council Member Fallot presiding.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Tom Ault reported on the following items:

- A crew has been working at night cleaning out the downstairs of 132 East Main Street.
- Planning Director Vince Marion reported on the residential demolitions and asbestos removal. Eslich was selected to do the work. Total cost \$65,750. A grant was received from the Stark County Land Bank in the amount of \$27,250.

FINANCIAL REPORT OF RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS FOR THE MONTH ENDING AUGUST 31, 2015

Council was presented with a financial statement prepared by the Department of Finance indicating the City’s financial status for the month ending August 31, 2015.

PERSONS APPEARING BEFORE COUNCIL

Rhonda Griffin of the Chamber of Commerce addressed the Council thanking the City for all of the help over the festival weekend. She informed the Council that Ricky Lee was very impressed with Louisville and its patriotism. Rhonda also thanked everyone for their help in the First Responder parade.

Ricky Lee will return to Louisville to shoot a music video on October 16th.

George Wasity and Commander Luke Patrino representatives from the Combat Veterans Association addressed the Council and thanked them for the First Responders procession and for bringing attention to the Armed Services, police and fire units for their service to the country. It was an honor and a privilege riding in the event.

Jennifer Kiko from Congressman Bob Gibbs office addressed the Council and presented a proclamation for the First Responders Parade.

Joyce Hudnell of the Constitution Committee addressed the Council and thanked everyone for all of the help they received for the weekend festival. She thanked the City for donating funds for the fireworks. Her committee was treated fairly and with constant courtesy and politeness.

Joyce then commented as a citizen. She was disappointed that all Council members were not in attendance at Constitution Week festivities. She went on to say that she was confronted by Council Member Guiley during the festival and said that it was an embarrassment to the City and a waste of taxpayer's dollars.

Pastor Larry Hinkle addressed the Council thanked the City for their cooperation with the Rock the Park concert and cited Olga Weber's desire to continue the virtues of the constitution so their importance should not be lost. Pastor Hinkle presented a certificate to Mayor-Council Member Pat Fallot.

Maggie McNutt of 300 Willow Avenue addressed the Council expressing concerns regarding flooding issues behind Ace Hardware. There are tall weeds not being mowed. She had standing water on her property for 30 days this summer. She did not agree with the City charging her \$75 for a zone change necessary for her storage shed. She said the change was necessary due to the changes made by Ace Hardware.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 15-33. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member Fallot declared Ordinance No. 15-33 duly passed and enacted.

ORDINANCE NO. 15-34 – BEING AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF STARK COUNTY, OHIO FOR COST SHARING IN THE USGS GAGING PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the first reading of Ordinance No. 15-34. The vote: All yea.

MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER FALLOT MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried to suspend the rules to allow for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 15-34. The vote: All yea.

COUNCIL MEMBER GUILY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE, and the motion carried for the emergency adoption of Ordinance No. 15-34. The vote: All yea. Mayor-Council Member Falot declared Ordinance No. 15-34 duly passed and enacted.

NEW BUSINESS

COUNCIL MEMBER GUIDONE MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER GUILY, and the motion carried not to request a hearing on a new liquor license to Brookside of Louisville LLC, DBA Brookside Farms, 5440 Ravenna Av NE, Louisville, OH 44641. The vote: All yea.

Council Member Guidone addressed the audience informing everyone that changes in his job require extra-long hours that prevented him from attending some of the weekend activities, but he does support them. His work demands are the reason he chose not to run for re-election. He will try to attend as many community functions as time permits.
