COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER FLORY, and the motion carried for the second reading of Ordinance No. 16-07. The vote: All yea. Vice Mayor-Council Member Guiley declared Ordinance No. 16-07 duly passed and enacted.

**ORDINANCE NO. 16-09** – BEING AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 149 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE

COUNCIL MEMBER FLORY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER ALJANCIC and the motion carried to table Ordinance No. 16-09 until the April 4, 2016 Council meeting, for the reason that Council Members have questions for City Manager Tom Ault. The vote: All yea.

**ORDINANCE NO. 16-10** – BEING AN ORDINANCE ADDING CHAPTER 150 OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE

COUNCIL MEMBER FLORY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER ALJANCIC and the motion carried to table Ordinance No. 16-10 until the April 4, 2016 Council meeting, for the reason that Council Members have questions for City Manager Tom Ault. The vote: All yea.

**ORDINANCE NO. 16-11** - BEING AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A THREE YEAR CONTRACT WITH THE STARK COUNTY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION

COUNCIL MEMBER FLORY MOVED SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried to amend Ordinance No. 16-11, reducing the cost from \$20,000 to \$15,000. The vote: All yea.

Director of Planning & Development Vince Marion was asked to explain Ordinance No. 16-11 in more detail. Mr. Marion expanded that this contract is to purchase GIS for mapping water and sewer lines, to make a layered map for exact locations. He said Louisville is the last community in the area to update the current paper maps that are over a decade old. The cost will be split between Water and Sewer departments and that we are not charged for any unused time.

Bill Glick, Director of Service expanded the need for updated mapping stating that the current system has directions from sidewalks and trees that may not even be there anymore. This map is directly linked to the Stark County GIS system and that data is immediately uploaded once gathered.

**VICE MAYOR-COUNCIL MEMBER GUILLEY OFFERED MEMBERS OF THE SERVICE DEPARTMENT TIME TO SPEAK.**

Ben Woitas from Louisville Service Department spoke in favor of continuing Bryan Kuhn's employment in the Service Department. He further commented that Bryan is a dedicated, hard-working individual and is an asset to the department with the growth and development of Louisville.

Bryan Kuhn from the Louisville Service Department addressed the Council regarding his current employment with the City. He is a lifelong Louisville resident. He is proud of working with the Service Department and wishes to fulfill his entire career here.

**NEW BUSINESS**

COUNCIL MEMBER FLORY MOVED, SECONDED BY COUNCIL MEMBER CASAR, and the motion carried instructing City staff to prepare amended appropriations legislation removing the \$5,000 for fireworks. The vote: Flory yea, Guiley yea, Aljancic nay, Casar yea.

Council Member Guiley discussed that Bauman Court alley concepts downtown are being prepared by architects, Dave and Michael Yeagley.

Fire Chief Rod Bordner, reported that his staff and himself were called to a residence at 2:00am Saturday morning for a woman in labor. Mother and baby are doing well, this showing how important the 24/7 staffing is.

Director of Planning & Development Vince Marion reported that the transfer of funds to S. Nickelplate was completed.

Service Director William Glick, reported that the SR 44 railroad tracks project will begin in the next 30-45 days. A booster station on Edmar needs replaced. Engineers with Hammontree are drawing plans. The current booster station will remain in operation until the new one is completed. Mr. Glick reinforced the quality of work and character of employee, Bryan Kuhn

Vice Mayor-Council Member Guiley reported that solar lights will be installed at the recycling bins near the Chapel St. RR tracks.

The meeting was adjourned.
